Over 400 slides will be used to demonstrate techniques used for peripheral smear diagnosis of the Lymphoid Disorders

- Reactive lymphocytosis vs lymphoma.
- The new WHO classification of lymphocytic leukemias and lymphomas, including rare Leukemic variants. We will look at the majority of leukemic manifestations of these malignancies for better recognition.
- The old FAB classification of Acute Lymphocytic Leukemias for understanding morphological differences.
- The lymphoproliferative disorders, The new WHO classification of mature B-Cell lymphomas (CLL) (Aggressive transformation of CLL to acute prolymphocytic leukemia and/or the Richter's syndrome) PPL, HCL, Mantle Cell Lymphoma, Marginal Zone Lymphoma (nodal and splenic), Plasma cell Dyscrasias (multiple myeloma, plasma cell leukemia and lymphoplasmacytic lymphoma), Diffuse Large B – Cell Lymphoma and Burkitt lymphoma.
- The T-Cell lymphomas, including: Sezary Syndrome, ATLL, T – cell Prolymphocytic leukemia, and the NK lymphomas

INSTRUCTIONAL LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE to ADVANCED

INTERMEDIATE: Refresher course; some basic knowledge required;

ADVANCED: Highly technical: for those with at least five years of experience in a specialty area.
